A <u>DISABILITY</u> is a condition that makes it more difficult for a person to do certain activities or interact with the world around them. It can affect a person's movement, senses, thinking, communication, or daily activities.



Types of Disabilities

- 1. Physical Disabilities: Affect a person's mobility and physical functioning.
- 2. Sensory Disabilities: Affect the senses such as vision, hearing, or touch.
- 3. Intellectual Disabilities: Affect cognitive functioning, learning, and adaptive behavior.
- 4. Learning Disabilities: Impact how a person processes information, often affecting reading, writing, or math.
- 5. Mental Health / Psychiatric Disabilities: Affect a person's thinking, emotions, or behavior.
- 6. Developmental Disabilities: Begin in childhood and affect physical, learning, language, or behavior areas.
- 7. Neurological Disabilities: Result from impairment of the nervous system.
- 8. Chronic Illness-Related Disabilities: Long-term medical conditions that can limit daily activities.
- 9. Speech and Communication Disabilities: Affect speaking, language, or communication.
- 10. Invisible (Hidden) Disabilities: Not immediately noticeable but significantly impact daily life.
